1. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

2. MOMENT OF SILENCE AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Ryan called for a moment of silence followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States Flag.

3. PRESENTATIONS AND SPECIAL EVENT APPROVALS

3.1 Presentation to Parks and Recreation Director Eric Brown on his Service to the City

City Manager Garcia spoke about Parks and Recreation Director Eric Brown and presented him with a token of appreciation for his service with the City.

Parks and Recreation Director Eric Brown thanked the Commission, staff, and City Manager.

3.2 Recognition of Deputy Rolando Reyes and Deputy Jennifer Spicer, Broward Sheriff's Office - *Sponsored by Vice Mayor Lori Lewellen*

Vice Mayor Lewellen thanked Deputy Rolando Reyes and Deputy Jennifer Spicer for their assistance with the homeless outreach and presented certificates to Deputy Rolando Reyes and Deputy Jennifer Spicer.

3.5 Presentation of City Hall Atrium/Lobby Conceptual Renderings and Expansion Options - *Finance*

Chief Financial Officer Frank DiPaolo introduced the item and provided renderings of the proposed expansion.

Commissioner Salvino made a motion to approve the item.

Commissioner Davis asked about the timeframe for the project and Mr. Michelson commented that the total timeframe would be approximately 18 months.

Commissioner James asked about the functionality for the Chambers for meetings during the construction and Mr. Michelson responded that they would phase out the construction so that it does not affect normal operations.

The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Lewellen which carried 5-0 on roll call vote.

Mayor Ryan read the proclamation into the record and presented the proclamation.

5. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

5.1 City Manager

City Manager Garcia commended Marketing and Communications Division Director, Nannette Rodriguez, and Public Information Officer, Sussette Rodriguez, on their work with the Pioneer Magazine. Francisco Rojo with Landmark has reached out to the City for another opportunity for an affordable housing project. She and Deputy City Manager Sosa-Cruz have plans to meet to discuss details in the coming months. She commented that the State of the City Address was a success and truly remarkable. County Administrator, Monica Cepero has reached out to the City in support of the efforts with the homeless outreach and she is looking to work together further. She noted that the legislative meetings in Tallahassee were rescheduled to December 13th, and she is looking forward to bringing more monies to the City.

5.2 City Attorney

- Discussion Regarding Authority for City Attorney to Opt In or Out of the Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) Settlements and Possible Hiring of Outside Counsel

City Attorney Boutsis requested authority from the Commission to opt in or out of the PFAS settlements and possible hiring of outside counsel.

Consensus was received from the Commission to opt into the settlements and hire outside counsel.

5.3 City Clerk - Reminders

City Clerk Riera reminded the Commission of their upcoming CRA and Regular meetings on December 12, 2023, at 5:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.

6. PUBLIC SAFETY REPORTS

Captain Tarala gave an update on recent arrests and criminal activity in the City. He spoke about Read Across Broward at Collins Elementary and the Operation Medicine Cabinet and Shredding Event at Bass Pro Shops where 4,900 pounds of sensitive documents were turned in for destruction. The Department provided another active killer presentation with Dania Pointe staff. He noted Broward Sheriff's office will be having a turkey giveaway on Saturday off of 1st Street, and he reminded everyone of Commissioner James' Thanksgiving event on November 21st. He had a productive meeting with Deputy City Manager Sosa-Cruz and Fire Chief Pellecer regarding Critical Incidents and Infrastructure in different areas of concern. They met with the Chief, Deputy Chief and Administrative Sergeant of the airport and went over their reunification centers and their critical incident response.

Deputy City Manager Sosa-Cruz spoke about the meeting and the training that BSO conducts for any type of critical incidents.

Fire Chief Pellecer spoke about the emergency management meeting and said they plan to meet further with Port Everglades and different municipalities, and he reviewed which fire stations cover each area in the City. He provided an update on call volumes in the City and noted he will be losing 3 employees due to promotions but will be receiving 3 new employees to train the Dania way. He congratulated Randy Slack, Nico Sanchez, and Robert Griffin III on their promotions. He reminded everyone of their annual toy drive at Five Below on November 24th and 25th. He said most of the toys that they collect go back to Dania residents.

Commissioner James asked if she could contribute some of her contingency funds for the toy drive and Chief Financial Officer DiPaolo responded yes.

Each Commission member, City Manager Garcia and City Attorney Boutsis agreed to donate \$500.00 from their contingency accounts for a total of \$3,500.00.

Commissioner Davis spoke about former Vice Mayor and Commissioner Bill Harris and gave her condolences to his family. She gave her condolences to former Mayor Albert Jones on the passing of his wife, Carolyn Jones. She commented that she attended several events since the last meeting, and she is requesting to use \$1,000.00 of her contingency funds for Mail Chimp or Constant Contact to be able to put her updates in a monthly newsletter. Consensus was received from the Commission. She noted that she attended the Dan Marino Foundation Gala and commended the Mayor on the State of the City Address.

Commissioner James asked about the cost for a subscription for all the Commission to be a part of the email blast. Chief Financial Officer Frank DiPaolo said they will work with the communications team and IT to get a subscription.

15.2 Commissioner James

Commissioner James spoke about former Vice Mayor and Commissioner Bill Harris. She commented that he was very serious about his service and love of his City and thanked him for his service. She noted that the City also lost Frank Loconto, who did her State of the City Address. She thanked Eric Brown for his service to the City. She noted that she had fun on Veteran's Day and thanked the Mayor for making this a Purple Heart City. She said she had fun at the Disney opening at Port Everglades. She congratulated the Mayor on a beautiful State of the City and said he has done an amazing job and is a great representation of this City. She reminded everyone of her Thanksgiving event on November 21st and invited everyone to come out.

15.3 Commissioner Salvino

Commissioner Salvino gave his condolences to Luis Rimoli and the family of former Vice Mayor and Commissioner Bill Harris and to Albert Jones on the passing of his wife, Carolyn Jones. He noted he attended many of the same events previously mentioned. He is asking for consensus for \$2,000.00 from his contingency funds for The Prestige Clubs etiquette luncheon. Consensus was received from the Commission. Vice Mayor Lewellen said she usually supports the other school and is happy to continue to do so. 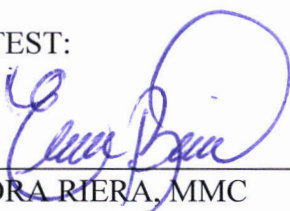
15.5 Mayor Ryan

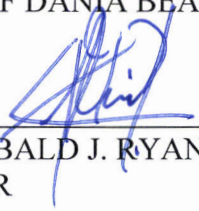
